CONFERENCE VENUE

St Catherine's College, or St Cat's as it's affectionately known, is a residential college for women in tertiary education in Perth.



Located at the University of Western Australia (UWA), St Catherine's is immediately adjacent to King's Park and the Swan River is a two minute walk away. The college is also located close to a shopping and café precinct and buses to both the City and Fremantle, stop outside the college.

St Cat's offers private single room accommodation. Rooms are fully made-up with linen and towels provided and are serviced every second day. Modern bathroom facilities are shared between guests.

A separate lounge area with TV, kitchenette and outdoor area will also be available for delegates. All guest rooms will have a direct dial telephone with free local calls provided. STD/IDD and mobile calls are available at additional cost, as is internet access.



DAY TRIP TO NEW NORCIA

New Norcia, 132 kilometres north of Perth, is unique to Australia. Benedictine monks from Spain established a monastery here in 1846 and it remains a monastery where monks follow the Rule of St. Benedict, living a simple, prayerful life. New Norcia is named after Norcia, a city in the region of Perugia in Italy, the birthplace of St. Benedict (480-543).

New Norcia was founded as a mission to the indigenous peoples of the Victoria Plains. It then became a centre of education in the early 1900s, but now the primary focus of the town is hospitality.

The monastery and its surrounding buildings look like a piece of old Spain in the Australian bush. As well as its heritage buildings, the town has a large art and artefact collection, an extensive library of books, and a comprehensive archive. The town is now a most valuable asset of the National Estate.

SITE VISIT TRINITY THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE

Trinity Theological College is an evangelical, reformed and non-denominational ministry training centre.

Trinity was formed in 1998 when the Perth Centre for Applied Christian Studies and Westminster Theological College (Perth) merged. The college moved to Trinity House in May 2004.

Trinity House is a purpose-designed building capable of housing up to 200 full-time students.
