

## Guidelines for Honorary life membership (1994 revised 2008)

1. In order to recognize length of service to theological libraries, the Board may, when appropriate, bestow Honorary Life Membership of ANZTLA.
2. The recipient will be a person who, in the opinion of the Board, has made a significant contribution to the development of theological libraries in Australia or New Zealand over a period of years. Recipients will not necessarily be librarians.
3. The Board will encourage ANZTLA members and Chapters to submit nominations for Honorary Life Membership.

If Honorary Life Membership is to be conferred, then:

4. The Conference Committee, in consultation with the Board, will allocate a time for a ceremony at which the Award will be presented, normally at either the conference dinner or the Annual General Meeting.
5. The Board will arrange the ceremony at which the Award will be presented
6. Honorary Life Membership has no monetary value, but consists of a certificate stating:  
“Awarded by the Australian and New Zealand Theological Library Association to record the long and faithful service given by [name] to theological libraries in Australia and New Zealand. [Date].”  
Further details of the recipient’s contribution may be added to the certificate and changes may be made by the Board where appropriate. The certificate should be framed, attractive and dignified.
7. The certificate will be supplied by the Board from ANZTLA funds for presentation at the Conference
8. The recipient should be informed in advance of the Honorary Life Membership by the Board and be invited to attend the presentation ceremony.
